

Admissions Process

If, following a visit to school, you would like to register your child for a place at Netherleigh and Rossefield School, please complete the application form and return to school with a non-refundable deposit of £50.

Upon receipt of the registration fee we will allocate a place in the appropriate class for your child.

A copy of your child's birth certificate will be required before your child actually takes up the place.

If, at the time of registration we are full, you will be notified and your child will be placed on our waiting list.

Places will be allocated in order of applications received.

Entry Points to School

Nursery Class – This is a pre-school year (3+) for children born on or before 31st August of that academic school year. Sessions are offered for mornings only or full time if required. More details will be discussed at your visit to school. There are also a few places for children aged 2. These children generally attend half days only, however full days can be arranged dependant on the maturity of the child. Nursery can take a maximum of 22 children at any one session.

Reception class and later entry – Places are available to enter school at any stage from Reception to Year 6 providing the maximum class size for each class has not been reached. Pupils can enter at any point during the year, although September is the most common entry point.

At the end of Year 6, pupils from Netherleigh and Rossefield School go to various schools – many take the entrance examination to Bradford Grammar School and North Halifax Grammar School. Requirements for this examination are covered within our curriculum and our children are well prepared for entry to all other secondary schools. (We prepare children aged 6 years and upwards for entry to Bradford Grammar School.)

Nursery/Foundation Stage

All children aged 3 or 4 are entitled to 15 hours a week free of charge. Eligible parents can also claim an additional 15 hours per week for 3 and 4 year old children, providing that certain criteria is fulfilled. See the following website for more details:

Any additional hours are charged at £6.75 per hour. Free places are offered to eligible 2 year old children. Children who do not qualify for a free place will be charged at the rate of £6.75 per hour.

Activities at School

Music – All classes have a weekly music lesson with our music specialist. We have a school choir which is held on a Monday lunchtime.

Computing – All classes from Year 1 upwards have a weekly lesson with our ICT specialist. We have a Computer Club who meet every week.

Sport – School has peripatetic teachers who both come into school once a week to take P.E. lessons with Reception upwards. All classes from Year 2 to Year 4 go swimming each week at Shipley Pool. Year 5 and 6 play tennis at Heaton Tennis and Squash club. Various after school sports clubs take place on a weekly basis.

Languages – French is taught to classes from Year 2 upwards by our specialist language teacher.

Breakfast Club – This starts at 7:45am. This costs up to £2 and includes cereal, toast and juice. Children can be regular attendees or use this on an ad-hoc basis.

After School Care – This starts at 3:45pm and is available until 5:30pm. Children are charged £2.00 for each 30 minute block. Children can be regular attendees or use the club on an ad-hoc basis (where space allows). A snack of biscuits and juice is served to all children. The children enjoy table top and floor activities, and outside activities on fine days

Foundation Stage

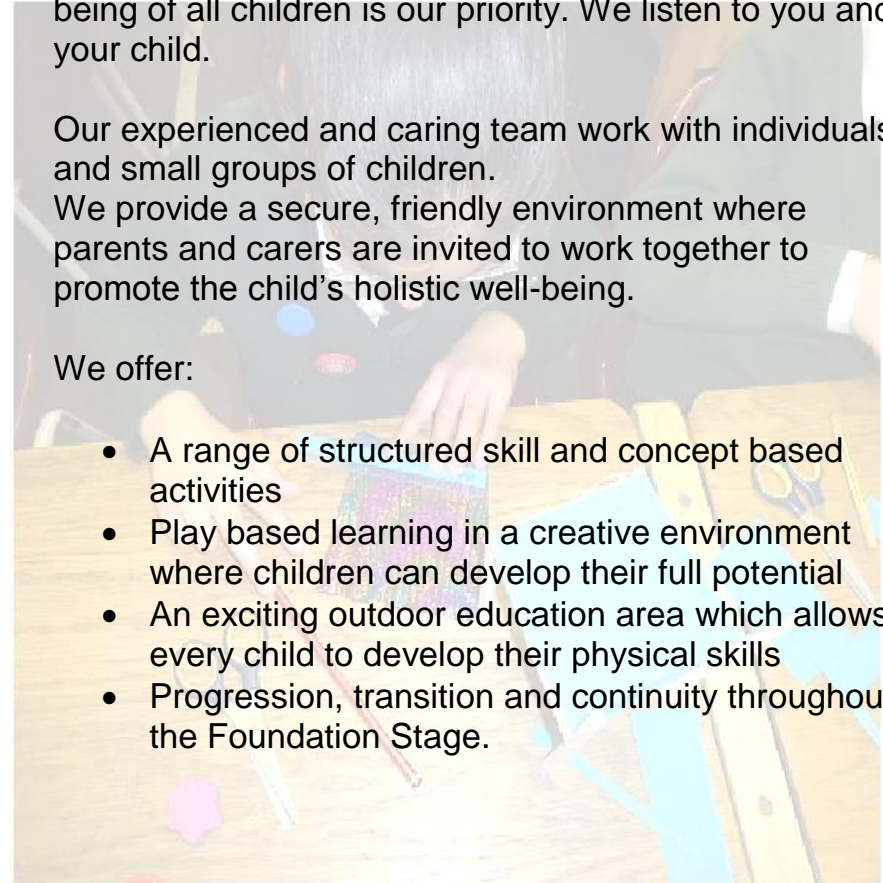
In the Foundation Stage we follow the Early Years areas of learning. The emotional and physical well-being of all children is our priority. We listen to you and your child.

Our experienced and caring team work with individuals and small groups of children.

We provide a secure, friendly environment where parents and carers are invited to work together to promote the child's holistic well-being.

- A range of structured skill and concept based activities
- Play based learning in a creative environment where children can develop their full potential

Key Stage 1 and 2

Education is a lifelong journey at Netherleigh and Rossefield School, we realise the importance of a good start. It is here that the foundations for learning, already established in our Early Years, are strengthened. We encourage children to discuss topics in class, to find things out for themselves and to follow up work with their own research, thus developing enquiring minds.

Pupils in Nursery, Reception and Year 1 are taught mainly by their class teachers. As they progress into Years 2 – 6, there is an increasing emphasis on specialist teaching. The range of subjects taught includes English, Math, Science, Computing, Geography, History, French, Music, Art, R.E, Swimming and PSHCEE (Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economic education).

Pupils are taught in small classes by well qualified staff dedicated to the children in their class.

Our pupils learn in a caring and positive atmosphere and are encouraged to 'have a go' and 'do their best'. We recognise each child is unique and has a distinct set of abilities and talents. In addition to what happens in the classroom we enhance the children's learning by bringing in visitors and taking the children out on a variety of trips.

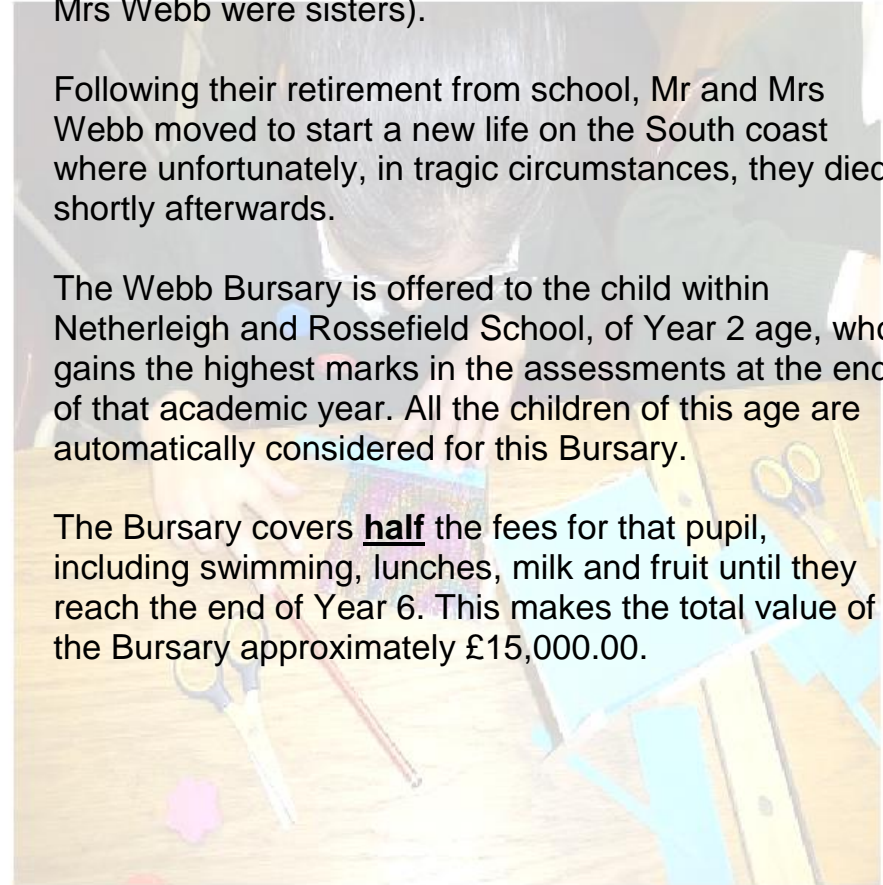
The Webb Bursary

Mr and Mrs Webb ran Netherleigh and Rossefield School prior to Mr and Mrs Nelson (Mrs Nelson and Mrs Webb were sisters).

Following their retirement from school, Mr and Mrs Webb moved to start a new life on the South coast where unfortunately, in tragic circumstances, they died shortly afterwards.

The Webb Bursary is offered to the child within Netherleigh and Rossefield School, of Year 2 age, who gains the highest marks in the assessments at the end of that academic year. All the children of this age are automatically considered for this Bursary.

The Bursary covers **half** the fees for that pupil, including swimming, lunches, milk and fruit until they reach the end of Year 6. This makes the total value of the Bursary approximately £15,000.00.
