Progress Monitoring Visit – Monday 19th June 2017

Dear Parents,

We received an unannounced school inspection on Monday 19th June 2017 from the Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI.) This was a one day inspection and the focus of the visit was on the quality of education provided; the welfare, health and safety of pupils; the suitability of staff; the suitability of the school's premises; the provision of information; the manner in which complaints were handled and the quality of leadership and management.

We are delighted to report that the ISI inspectors concluded that our school successfully meets all of the relevant requirements of the Education (Independent School Standards) Regulations 2014 and requirements of the Early Years Statutory Framework 2014.

I am delighted that this report recognises the hard work that staff have put into creating a happy, safe and effective learning environment for your children. The following sentence exemplifies this: "Pupils and children in the EYFS behave well in lessons and respond promptly to the high expectations set by staff." Parental links were also praised. Inspectors acknowledged that "staff... work effectively with parents to ensure continuity of learning between home and school."

I take great pleasure in enclosing this report for your perusal. Hopefully this report reassures all of our parents that their children are in good hands at Netherleigh and Rossefield School.
